Cuban Big Band Orquesta Akokán to Play Chicago's Epiphany Center for the Arts on Tuesday, April 26 at 8PM CST

Grammy-nominated Daptone recording artists ORQUESTA AKOKÁN thrilled to announce '16 Rayos' tour with a special stop in the Windy City

CHICAGO (April 5, 2022) – Orquesta Akokán, the Latin Jazz ensemble formed by musicians from Cuba and New York, is on tour in the U.S. and will be performing at the Epiphany Center for the Arts, 201 S. Ashland Ave in Chicago, Illinois, on Tuesday, April 26 at 8PM CST. This 21+ show, supported by the International Latino Cultural Center of Chicago, is on sale now with 'Reserved Table' options for 2-4 adults (\$100-\$200), General Admission seating at \$35, advance 'Standing Room' tickets at \$25, and \$35 "walk-up" tickets at the door day-of-show. Doors open at 7:30PM.

Cuban big band Orquesta Akokán released its latest album *16 Rayos* on October 22, 2021 via Daptone Records. *16 Rayos* is a triumphant follow-up to their Grammy-nominated debut from 2018.

Led by dynamic singer José "Pepito" Gómez, producer Jacob Plasse and arranger Michael Eckroth, and fused with the "island's greatest instrumentalists" (according to *The New York Times*) from storied groups including Irakere, NG La Banda, and Los Van Van, Orquesta Akokán united in Havana once again to record at Egrem Studios.

The cohesion forged by several years of international touring (including stops at Lincoln Center, WOMAD Australia and New Zealand, North Sea Jazz Festival, Festival Salsa al Parque, Kennedy Center and many more) blossomed into an intimate dialogue between good friends, allowing for fearless musical exploration, risk-taking, development, and expression. Contemporary sensibilities, mixed with a deep spiritual reservoir and knowledge of folkloric traditions, propel the grooves into previously uncharted vistas while dismantling the conventions of what is considered mambo.
